Our new CPD strands are designed to meet the needs of teachers at different career stages, and incorporate opportunities to apply the new learning and techniques covered during the sessions. Attendees will also benefit from session recordings, support materials and receive certificates of attendance that help to capture their professional development commitment.

Introducing the new strands

Strand 1: Introduction to Citizenship

This strand is designed for anybody who is new to the subject, from ITE trainees to experienced teachers who are teaching Citizenship for the first time. These events will allow participants to develop their understanding of the core substantive knowledge of the subject, key concepts and best practice in pedagogy.

Strand 2: GCSE Network

Building on our current strong network of GCSE teachers, we have developed a bespoke strand for members who teach GCSE Citizenship Studies. The focus of sessions will include improving outcomes for the Citizenship Investigation (active citizenship), examination technique, and opportunities for teachers to support each other with moderation of assessments.

Strand 3: Leading Citizenship

Leading Citizenship can be complex and often involves non specialist teachers taking on the role. This strand will look at the logistical role of subject leaders to embed Citizenship successfully across the school. It also helps those who lead Citizenship across multiple schools and need to develop their understanding of research-informed practice and how this influences the curriculum.

Strand 4: Politics, Elections and Society

Building upon the CPD offering in the previous year and feedback from our members, we have introduced a new strand entitled 'Politics, Elections and Society' which provides broader subject knowledge enhancement and incorporates a range of elements from previous CPD strands.



In addition to these CPD opportunities we will continue to run national events and conferences bringing together Citizenship teachers and academics from across the country. Our termly virtual staffrooms will continue to provide an opportunity for our community to meet in a relaxed environment to discuss current issues and share practical ideas.
